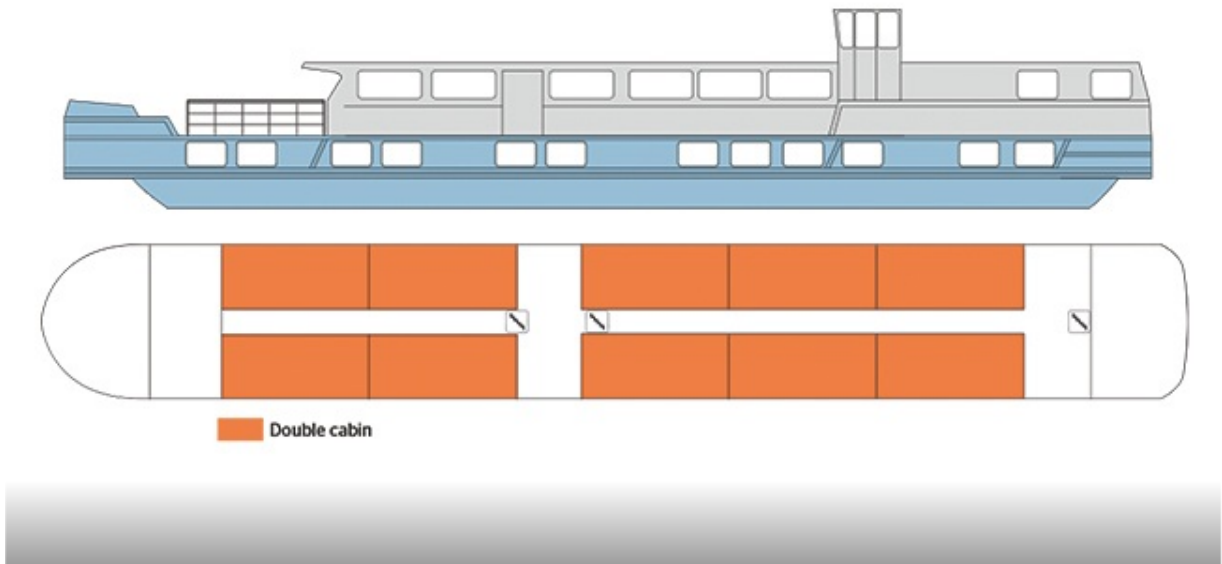
- Canal cruise, measuring 38.5m long and 5m wide
